Upon your arrival in Brest

From the train station

to the Conference centre Le Quartz: 5 minutes walk

to the university residence: bus line 1 (towards Hôpital Cavale) or bus line 5 (towards Provence), stop at Kermenguy and walk 10 minutes

From the airport to the Conference centre Le Quartz and university residence

On Saturday 2 July

From the airport to the university residence and the city centre

The easiest way to reach the university residence or city centre is by taxi (cost 20-30€).

Otherwise, you may use the airport shuttle that will take you to a tramway station nearby.

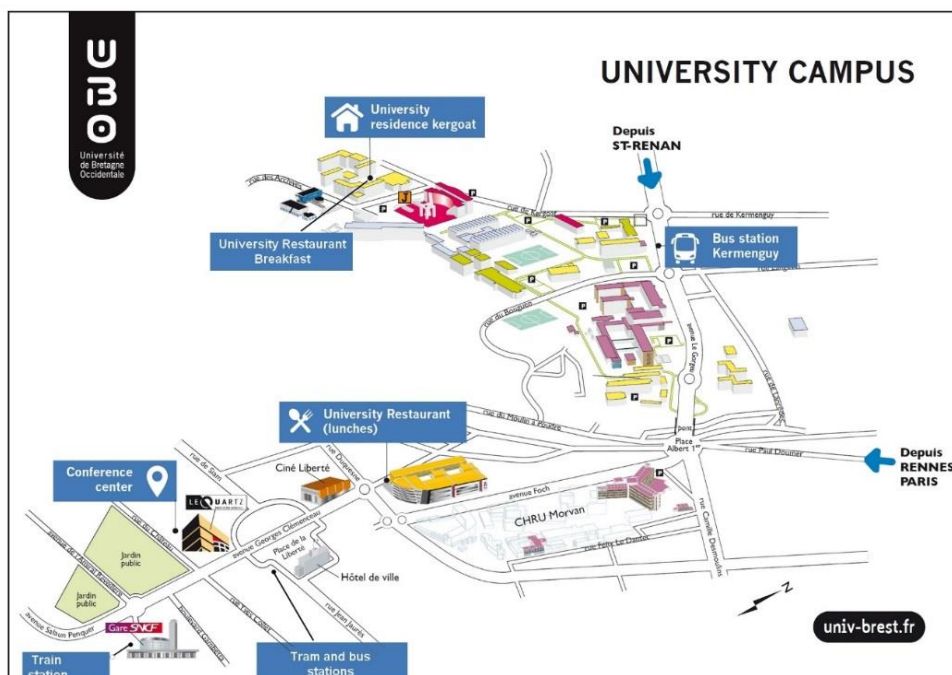
Take the tramway and stop at Liberté (city centre, near the conference venue).

To continue to the university residence, take bus line 1, 5, 9 or 10 and stop at Kermenguy (10 min. walk to the university residence).

On Sunday 3 July

In addition to regular public transportations and taxi:

- Two ICCC2016 shuttles will serve from the airport to the Conference centre (Le Quartz) and the university residence with departure from the airport at noon and 11.15 pm.
- 2 ICCC2016 shuttles will serve from the airport to the Conference centre in Brest with departure from the airport at 2:30 pm and 6:00 pm.
- 7 shuttles will serve from the Conference centre (Le Quartz) to the university residence KERGOAT on Sunday 3 July afternoon at 2:00 pm, 3:00 pm, 4:00 pm, 6:15 pm, 7:30 pm, 8:00 pm and 8:30 pm



Technical information for communications

Oral communications

A preview room located level 0 will be operating from Sunday 3, afternoon to Friday 8, morning.

Speakers should bring and check their files half a day before their presentations.

Format of oral communications

Plenary lectures: 40 minutes without questions

Keynote lectures: 30 minutes including questions

Invited lectures: 20 minutes including questions

Oral communications: 15 minutes including questions

Speakers are asked to respect these talk durations. Moderators will receive strict recommendations in this regard to ensure smooth and synchronized continuity of parallel sessions.

Conference rooms will be equipped with pc computers with Microsoft Office, OpenOffice and acrobat reader softwares, beamers and slideshow laser pointers.

Poster communications

Posters will be displayed throughout the week.

Two poster sessions are scheduled:

General information

Eating:

Lunches will be served for registered persons at the Restaurant Universitaire near the conference centre from Monday to Friday. Opening hours: 11.45 am-1.45 pm. No tickets sold on site.

A large variety of restaurants and bars are located around the conference centre or near the harbor (30 min walk from the conference centre).

There are no restaurants near the university residence.

Tipping in restaurants and bars is not mandatory as service is included in the prices. However, 5-10% tips are usual when you are satisfied by the service.

Shopping:

Shops usually open between 7 and 9 am and close between 7 and 8 pm.

Shops are closed on Sunday.

Weather: Overall, the climate of “Finistère” presents the characteristics of an oceanic climate. Atlantic perturbations bring regular rain in all seasons.

Overall, the climate is characterized by temperate summers. Maximum average temperatures in July range from 18 to 21 °C *i.e.* chilly mornings (15 °C) and mild afternoons (25 °C).

Power supply

Voltage in France is 220 V, 50 Hz with European type sockets. Don't forget your adaptor!
